

Empowering Girls at Horizonte Rose Park

On February 28th for our Big Goal Accelerator Project, we had a smaller group of 7 girls. Kathy Margaritis and Michelle Jackson lead the discussion which was based on the DIBI Exploring Careers curriculum. The icebreaker activity helped the girls identify their personality and values with the Either-Or Choice game, which they discussed with peers and us. They then clarified their top 10 values by sorting through the value cards. When sharing a few of their top values, many of them mentioned self respect, trust, and loyalty. They further explored with the Work Values Inventory and figured out which career options fit best with their values. The girls attending all seemed engaged and to enjoy the presentation and activities.

Thanks to Soroptimist members assisting with small groups: Donna Schultz, Carma Ingram, and Rita Offrett. Rita's granddaughter, Dayna joined right in with the girl's groups to help even out numbers. A potential member, Christine Lutz also attended with Rita.

An Inspiring Evening with LYD Winner, Shirlee Draper

A small group of Soroptimist SLC club went to support Ogden's Live Your Dream awards fundraiser on February 18th. It was inspiring for me to learn about our 2014 LYD winner that went all the way to winning the national award. Shirlee Draper was born and raised in "Short Creek" (a polygamous community). After leaving the community, she obtained a Bachelor of Social Work and a Master of Public Administration. She credited the help of the LYD awards in being able to advance so far in school.

She has since served in many capacities in the rebirth of her hometown, including facilitating the election of the first female mayor in 2017, opening a community health clinic in 2019, and working to improve the health of all residents. She is employed as Director of Operations for Cherish Families, a social service nonprofit which offers crime victim and other services for people from polygamous backgrounds who need stability. Shirlee specializes in providing education for outside service providers and government agencies to facilitate cultural competence in dealing with fundamentalist community members. It's amazing to see how far a person can go with a helping hand up to be able to move forward and make a better life for her family and community.

The SI Ogden club awarded several LYD scholarships and had a few of the winners tell their stories. I was blown away by the young lady that said she had not had electricity for the first 18 years of her life. Now she is training to be an electrician and loves it. There were many uplifting stories and also service awards given to a community group and a high school senior. We enjoyed our evening with Soroptimist friends, a great meal, and intermingling with those from other clubs and businesses.
