Soroptimist International of the Americas Grant Update

A year ago in June our club was awarded the Soroptimist Club Grant for Education and Economic Empowerment. When we applied for the grant it was initially to be for college books for our Dream It Be It girls graduating from High School. We realized early on that we may not be able to buy college books in time for the DIBI graduates as they would not be entering college before the time the grant would expire. We made a request to SIA that we revise the grant to allow us to buy books for former Live Your Dream awardees as well as the women that had been involved in the DIBI program. We were able to use up our complete \$3,000 grant purchasing books for 5 ladies:

We received a very lovely email from Jazmyn Eichler as follows:
