She challenged us to go out of our comfort zone and connect with someone different from ourselves.

• Informative workshops- Volunteer Management, Making the Ask: Soroptimist Mission-Focused Fundraising, Insight into the Future of SIA's Programs, among others. It was so helpful to hear input and comments from other clubs on what they are doing and their challenges and successes. We got lots of good ideas which we passed along to President Barbara.

• We heard from two SIA Live Your Dream winners- one a young lady who escaped from a war-torn country where girls are not allowed to go to school. She is studying financial planning, focused on women. The other was a survivor of poverty and abuse who is using her experience to work with offenders in prison, helping them break the cycle of abuse. These young ladies were AMAZING and we could see the impact the Live Your Dream program has in changing lives.



• Leadership- President Bobbi Enderlin, SIA Executive Director/CEO Michelle Burnett, and incoming President Ginger Cole all shared thoughtful and inspiring messages. I loved an experience shared by Bobbi-When she was asked to serve in a club position, she used to hem and haw, and feel like she couldn't do it, often declining. Then she had a revelation- I was asked, so they must think I'm capable! She started responding, "I'd be honored."

• Fun- As members of the Laurel Society, we were all invited to the 'Pretty in Pink' party where everyone was dressed in pink! 'Denim and Diamonds' was a night of sparkle and dancing. And lastly, the Closing Gala (we loved changing into all our fun outfits!) An enticing variety of delicious food was laid out for us at each event- and the hotel was just lovely. Set in a chic neighborhood, we also sampled seafood at the local restaurants (Oysters! Crab Cakes! Clam Chowder! -this is Washington, remember.) President Barbara introduced the theme for the 2024-25 year of "Empowering Women and Girls". The group talked about what this means to them. Support, inspiration and resources were just a few of the answers.

We played the game, 2 Truths and a Lie where each person tells 3 things about themselves. Two of the things are something that really happened and the other is a lie. The rest of the group must guess which one is a lie. The lies came through loud and clear as most of us didn't do a good job convincing the others that it really happened. It was a fun game to play and gave us a chance to get to know others in the group better.

After that, we went over the Vision and Mission of SIA along with SIA's Big Goal and Big Goal Accelerator Projects. SIA's Big Goal is to invest in the dreams of 500,000 women and girls through access to education.

Next, we talked about the 4 Pillars-Service and Programs, Philanthropy, Public Awareness and Membership. In each of the areas, we spent time going over our plans for each. In Service, we are working to find a group that might be better suited for the Dream It Be It program than high school girls. In Philanthropy, the club is planning an on-line auction in the fall and a fundraiser in the spring. Public Awareness positions include Social Media, Newsletter Editor and Website Administrator. These tasks can all be done from home. Finally in Membership, we need to concentrate on growing membership, mentoring, recognition and keeping in touch with our members.



My name is Barbara Rosner. I was born in Peru and lived there until 1998. I met my husband when we worked at the mines in Peru. We got married and came to the United States. It was a significant change in my life. Back then, my beloved grandparents, parents, and youngest brother were still in Peru, and I missed them very much. The food was another challenge; it was not tasty for me and was nothing compared to Peruvian food.

My husband taught me how to drive, and I have enjoyed it ever since. I used to live a very active life in Peru, but when I arrived in Elko, Nevada, I felt bored. There was nothing to do, no friends, and only Mexican and American fast food. I decided to look for a job and found one as an associate in Office-Max in the area of CopyMax. It was a great fit, and I loved it. Being promoted to Supervisor in the area made some co -workers jealous, and I found it hard to work in that environment. So I decided to look for something else. I got a job as a Spanish instructor at the Great Basin College in Elko, and I had fun being a teacher. Also, I volunteered 8 hours a

week in the ESL program. After having my first child, I decided to take time off work to be a mom. What a challenge and a sweet time it has been. When my son was two, we moved to Salt Lake City and have settled here since. I had my second child, who was born with special needs and found myself with more challenges. Those challenges turned into opportunities and helped my family to be together and united.

I always love to volunteer and help people. I was introduced to Soroptimist thanks to Nancy Mitchel. The mission of the club aligned with my mission. Coming from a traditional Peruvian family, fitting into a male's world was complicated. I always thought there was more than attending university and getting married. Being a Soroptimist gave me a more comprehensive vision of what it means to be a woman in this society and that my experiences will be able to help other women achieve their best. I'm a Soroptimist because I can help change women's lives. It is my contribution and commitment to society and myself.



In loving memory ... Aura Gutierrez - January 7, 1993 – September 1, 2024

Aura was one of our Horizonte Young Parents girls. We met her when she was about 15 and she attended all of our young parent classes where we taught selfreliance and encouraged the girls to attend higher education. During that program Janis taught a class about managing money. Aura always told us that it was that class that inspired her to save money and helped her to take care of herself and her daughter at the time. We also had a book buying program where we met the girls at their college of choice and bought their books.

Aura was so proud that she was able to buy a car and get her own apartment and ultimately bought her own home. She always credited the Soroptimist with teaching her the path to financial security. Over the years we had the opportunity to meet Aura at SLCC and buy her books. Later she was employed at Horizonte as a secretary so we continued to stay connected. We asked Aura to come to DIBI and speak to the girls about things that she had overcome. Her life was hard and she worked to overcome many hardships including cancer. She was diagnosed with stage 4 liver cancer which took her life. She was a beautiful person and we loved her. She is survived by her two daughters Yeretzi age 14 and Itzel age 10.
