## Hands-on Big Goal Accelerator Project By- Carma Ingram

On Saturday, November 9<sup>th</sup> ladies from our club, Donna Visco, Donna Schultz, Michelle Jackson, Rita Offrett, Jan Crane, Kathy Margaritas, Pat Murdoch and Carma Ingram, provided a presentation at the Geradine E. King Women's Resource Center, in Salt Lake City.

The Geraldine E. King Women's Resource Center provides emergency shelter to 200 women experiencing homelessness in and around Salt Lake City every night. Beyond providing safe emergency shelter, this facility provides essential basic needs such as meals, clothing, hygiene items, a place for women to wash clothes and shower, as well as, being a welcoming environment for companion animals. Our group went there to accomplish our mission of contributing to the Big Goal Accelerator Project (BGAP).

Donna Visco led a discussion for the women attending on emerging trends regarding scams and fraud. She also demonstrated to the women how to set up an email account. Having an email account will assist them in communication regarding job applications and education programs that are available on line.



SIA has certain criteria for qualification in submitting our BGAP, which include:

- Work only with women and/or girls who are *facing obstacles* who are not already served by or counted under the Dream Programs (Live Your Dream Awards and Dream It, Be It)
- Provide access to education with the ultimate goal of economic empowerment
- Be a Soroptimist-led hands-on project
- Be reported to SIA through the official reporting link.

Our group met with 13 ladies in this first session and Pat will be handing out the material we printed to other ladies living at the Center. We will be going back for another session on Saturday, **January 18<sup>th</sup>, 2:00 p.m.** We expect to report 60 or more women to SIA for our Women's Resource Center Project. Mark your calendar for January 18, if you are able to participate!

"I really appreciated your support of the clients at the shelter. The homeless situation has been close to my heart most of my life. I volunteered at The Road Home for many years and have worked for Volunteers of America at the women's shelter for five years.

When I was a young girl, my heart broke when I saw the disabled men from the Korean War on wheel boards selling pencils for a penny. I tried to talk my mother into letting them live in our chicken coop, she naturally declined! Carma Ingram then lit her candle from the SIA candle and lit the Peaks to Plains candle. Jan Crane lit her candle from the Peaks to Plains candle and lit the SI Salt Lake candle. One by one, our remaining members were invited, in order of their seniority in the club, to light their candles from the Salt Lake club candle. Bearing candles with the light of Soroptimist, we renewed our commitment to this organization we all hold dear.

Then it was time to get to work making **Candy Bags for Breakfast with Santa**. While we were working, President Barbara read aloud the slips where we'd documented what we were thankful for. We made over 60 bags for Santa to hand out to the children.


















## Breakfast with Santa - Kid's Clothing By– Donna Schultz

Once we know the number of children attending the event (61 this year), we determine the budget for each age group. Club members and other volunteers sign up to be shoppers. We obtain the ages and sizes of each child. With a modest amount to spend, our



shoppers look for bargains to give the kids the warm winter clothing they needbe it coats, shoes, boots, socks, pants, shirts, sweaters, sweatshirts, gloves or hats. Many of the shoppers contribute their own money as well.

#### Celebrating 15-year Membership Anniversaries

Membership committee member, Donna Schultz, announced two 15-year members. At our Nov. meeting, Jan Crane and Cathy Stevens were celebrated as each is at a 15-year membership milestone. Our club members will be celebrated at each 5-year anniversary.



This program provides guidance, training, and resources to prepare girls for career success. We will go to Roosevelt Continuation school on **Thursday, January 16th**, for our first session with them. The middle school girls will create dream boards and set goals toward achieving them. This school is a temporary placement for students who struggle in a regular school setting or have broken school rules. The two sessions will be with different groups of girls. For the first session, **arrive for set up at 8:15** it will run from 8:45 - 10:45. The second session will be 11:15 - 1:15. The school is located at 3225 So. 800 E., Millcreek (enter on 800 E from 3300 S).

The next day, **January 17th**, will be the second DIBI session for Granite Connection High, **arrive at 8:00 a.m**., class is 8:30-10:30a.m. It will focus on having resilience through challenges and the girls will determine what their values are and how that affects life and career choices. They will make some hands-on projects.

We will be having monthly classes at Horizonte Rose Park Youth-to-Adult program, an Adult Education program with students 17-20 years old, completing their high school diplomas. The classes will follow the DIBI curriculum but will be considered a BGAP since the students are in an Adult Education program now, rather than high school. Our first Dream board session will be **January 31st** from 11:00-12:30, **arrive at 10:30 a.m.** to set up. The address is 1400 W Goodwin Ave., SLC, Northwest doors of SLC SE. **Please consider helping out at one or more of these schools. It's a rewarding experience!**
